David Michalek's *Slow Dancing*

is an outdoor exhibit of video portraits featuring the world's leading dancers. Slowed down in "hyper slow motion", the films projected on large 16-foot screens celebrate the grace of motion. Representing classic and modern dance, each movement is stretched into a 10-minute film.

A photographer with a film school background, Michalek began his career as an assistant to famed photographer Herb Ritts, before getting his own portraits in such periodicals as *The New Yorker* and *Vogue*. Experimenting with the idea of three-dimensional portraiture, Michalek has participated in many community and public space art projects since the mid-90's.

Wednesday's event commissioned by the L.A. Music Center & presented by Dance Camera West will be the coming together of many art forms, photography, film, & dance. It's also a good opportunity to enjoy a night outside downtown before our chilly L.A. fall nights get here.

The event is free, although parking is \$8, but since true Angelenos never pay to park, you may want to take the Metro (yay!) or arrive early for a primo street spot.
